Have you made plans for the Apocalypse yet? If not, you're in luck. Murray Thorne, Maui's own guitar virtuoso and favorite Celtic Tiger, has something transformative up his sleeve. On December 20 and 21, he will turn the Supper Club at Stella Blues into a multisensory psychedelic homage to the rocking genius of Pink Floyd.

At a gig a couple of years back, Thorne found himself busting out "practically all of side one" of The Wall. That's when his rock-n-roll vision started to materialize. Little-by-little, he began scripting and refining an intense, personallyreflective slide show/movie to accompany his live performance, but the unique project might have remained a pipe dream,

had Thome not run into lighting mastermind Keith Langlois, whose deep love for all things Floyd drew him—and the high-tech "green" event lighting company Epic Lighting he runs with partner Aleta Lee—into the mix.

They put their creative juices into the pot and let the alchemic sorcery do its thing.

"This is a show for anyone who's a fan of Floyd, and anyone who wants a real audio-visual experience," Thorne said.


